## Mercy in the New Testament

- Jesus was asked for mercy multiple times.
- Jesus taught about Mercy in the parable of the Good Samaritan.
- Jesus spoke about Mercy in the Sermon on the Mount.
- I John 2:1-2 – “...And if anyone sins we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous and He Himself is the propitiation for our sins and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.”
- I John 4:10 – “In this is love, not that we loved God but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins.”
- Propitiation is the Greek rendering of the Hebrew Word in the OT that we translate “MERCY.” So the Mercy Seat was the place of Propitiation in the OT
