2 Corinthians 6:14 - 7:1

- 1) The main command in this passage is “do not be unequally yoked with unbelievers” (2 Cor. 6:14). Many people quote 2 Corinthians 6:14 and apply it to marriage relationships. Based on the context of 2 Corinthians 6:1-13, what do you think Paul has in mind when issuing this command?

How can we tell the difference between associating with someone, and being yoked to someone?

- 2) Last week, Paul expressed the importance of not putting obstacles in people’s way to the gospel (2 Cor. 6:3), but the application of this passage may appear to create an obstacle in connecting with unbelievers. What are some keys to living out both 2 Corinthians 6:3 and 2 Corinthians 6:14 concurrently?

- 3) How does our identity as a “temple of the living God” (2 Cor. 6:16) relate to the discussion of not being unequally yoked?

What other implications are there for someone who is a temple of the living God?

- 4) What is the connection between believing the promises Paul quotes in 2 Corinthians 6:16-18 and following the command in 2 Corinthians 7:1?

How do we “cleanse ourselves from every defilement of body and spirit”?
