



- 1) How do you think the people of Israel would have felt as they heard Amos prophesy judgment on their neighbors (Amos 1:3 – 2:3)?

How do you think they felt when Amos then prophesied judgment on them (Amos 2:4-16)?

- 2) Either in a study Bible or commentary look into the phrase, “For three transgressions... and for four...” which is repeated 8 times in these two chapters of Amos. What do you think God was communicating, through Amos, using that kind of verbiage?
- 3) Read Amos 1:6-8 and Joel 3:4-8... For each of the judgments God gives against the neighbors of Israel there is a history of their sin against God and His people. What does this teach us about God’s judgment and the methods He utilizes to see justice take place?
- 4) Read Amos 2:6-8; 12... This list of sins God shares in this section is jaw-dropping, especially because these are His people. In looking at the modern-day Church, what areas do you think even Gospel preaching/believing churches are ignoring that God may not be pleased with?
- 5) Read Amos 2:9-11... Why do you think God gives these reminders?

How can you proactively keep God’s past blessings, that He has given you, fresh in your memory?
