1) Read Amos 6:4-7 What repeated themes does Amos mention in this section that we have seen throughout the book of Amos?
2) Read Amos 7:7-9 What is meant with God's use of the "plumb line"?
What can we use as "plumb line" to help us determine if we are walking with God? What does Proverbs 27:17 suggest as another "plumb line" to reference in our walk with Jesus?
3) Read Amos 8:11-12 Why is this "famine" one of the greatest consequences God can give?
4) Read Amos 9:11-15 and Amos 5:11 God's judgment would mean that the current generations would not enjoy their ill-gotten gain; but one day a later generation would enjoy God's blessing again. Based on whose actions ir Amos 9:11-15 would God bring about this restoration?
5) Pastor Tim has said many times through the book of Amos that our desire is to be listening when God is speaking. How have you been challenged to listen to God over these weeks in Amos?
