Jesus had already been questioned by the Herodians (Matthew 22:15-22) and the Sadducees (Matthew 22:23-33) so He had been questioned by three groups of people who each desired to trip Him up, all in the same day.

Read the result of Jesus' question in Matthew 22:46... Why do you think Jesus caused the public debate to end?

4) Read Deuteronomy 6:4-9... After the command in verse 5, Moses follows with an application of keeping God's laws in view all throughout the day, specifically in a home. Why do you think Moses follows the command in verse 5 with this application?

How do you, or how could you, practice Deuteronomy 6:6-9 in your own life?

5) Read Leviticus 19:33-34... What is the reason given for treating a sojourner with love?

How does that principle relate to followers of Jesus today?
