Colossians 2:1-5

- 1) How does Paul describe the goal (and the means for that goal) of a church body in Colossians 2:2?

- 2) What implications come from Paul's statement that "all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge" (Colossians 2:3) are hidden in Christ?

- 3) The deception or deluding of "plausible arguments" (Colossians 2:4) that Paul describes seems to indicate a slow overtaking process, as opposed to someone openly trying to get the believers in Christ to change their core beliefs. Why is this slow process so much more effective and dangerous?

Are there any "plausible arguments" in the Christian's world today that you see as attempts to delude the centrality of Christ for the believer?

- 4) Read James 1:19-25... In James 1:22 we find the only other occurrence of the same word used in Colossians 2:4 for deceiving/deluding. What does James prescribe as the remedy to keep from deceiving ourselves?

- 5) Who is someone you can cheer on in their spiritual walk even though you don't get the blessing of living close to them? What is something you could do to encourage them this week?
